Prep News

The preps have been very busy lately with assembly and orientation. They did a wonderful job this week participating in the welcome liturgy for the Preps of 2017. Prep were joined by Years 4/5/6. This was the culmination of lots of practice and preparation leading up to this important day. The preps prepared a welcome gift to share with the new preps. The current preps looked very grown up and showed everyone how responsible they are especially now that they are near the end of their prep year. Well done preps of 2016!

Year 1 News

This week it was our turn to lead the Assembly Prayer. We greeted new families at the Prep Orientation morning. We watched the Melbourne Cup with the whole school. We practised logging in to laptops and IPads with our user names and passwords to do some numeracy and literacy tasks. We did Maths rotations of skip counting on number lines, writing the time to the hour and half hour on analogue clocks and buying grocery items with (plastic) Australian coins. We have been reading the Hairy Maclary Treasury, by Lynley Dodd each day. We watched National Geographic kids and learnt about sound and the reflection of light. Throughout the week, we began planning a class party together and had lots of fun doing swimming in PE.

Year 2 News

The students have been working with chance and data this week in maths, looking at the possibility of events and then using tally marks and graphs to share the information. We learnt to pose questions about this information to help compare and understand it. We also wrote a narrative story which we are still working on. This was a combination of descriptive ideas and following the criteria set and joining it altogether. The students worked really hard on this and we look forward to sharing these in class next week.

Year 3 News

The year I busy bees have been finishing their assessment pieces for English, French, Civics, and Music for Miss Cass. They've completed their world in Minecraft and have made amazing pieces of original music for composition. We've been using ipads to make our own Voki characters to share.
