The above quote just has to resonate with teachers and parents in our community. Like many schools, we have spent quite a lot of time and money keeping our software and hardware up to date with the latest technology. We have sought to improve our ratio of computers (including laptops, iPads). In 2017 we seek to have students to a point where we have one device per student in Years 4 to 6 and one device to approximately three students in Prep to Year 3.

It is important to us that we allow our students the opportunity to use a range of technologies in the classroom and for it to be readily available to them. We are, after all, teaching a generation of children whose futures will be predominantly online. However, what we use our technology for – and how we are integrating in into our curriculum effectively – is what is important.

Beginning in Prep and in subsequent years, we teach our students basic technology skills such as how to log in to websites like Reading Eggs; as well as how to go about opening documents, save them to files, and find and edit them for future use. By the time students reach Years 4, 5 and 6 they have personal emails that are regulated by the school, as well as the opportunity to create blogs and digital presentations for their units of work.

Another area that we, as a school, devote our time to is CyberSafety. We know that some of our students are using social media, despite their age. We also know how important it is for today's students to be aware of their digital footprint. Everything we post can be seen by anyone. There are many resources available across many platforms that support schools in teaching their students about the importance of being safe online. At St Joseph's we seek to provide detailed, substantiated policies and agreements to our community about safety with technology, and expect our students to use technology – both at school and at home – in an age-appropriate and positive way. Please do not hesitate to contact us about how your children are using technology – it is an area that our school is very passionate about. Because of our commitment to this area of the curriculum we are very well placed to prepare our kids for the digital world they currently live in, and the digital world of the future that remains unknown.

There is no doubt that our kids here at St Joseph's are advancing their skills very well. At this point the school seeks feedback from our parent community on the provision of 1:1 devices in Years 3 – 6 for 2017.

I ask all parents to respond to the following questions with their thoughts on how we progress in the future with the provision of technology for the students. Your feedback will assist us in making the best decision around the purchase of software and devices for the 2017 school year and further into the future. These 3 questions will be sent out in a separate email so that you are able respond to our questions.

Could I ask parents to have these responses to me by next Wednesday, 16th November.

Feedback sought:

1. Do you agree that we need to continue to increase the ratio of devices available to the children at school to support them in their educational needs? YES/ NO
2. Would you support the purchase of 1:1 devices in Years 3- 6 ? YES /NO
3. Provision of 1: 1 devices in Years 3 – 6 will increase the ratio of school owned devices available to students in P – 3.
Would you be willing to enter into an agreed payment plan of between \$10 and \$15 dollars per week over 3 years to give your child a personal device of their own fulltime in Year 3 -6? YES / NO

I thank you in advance for your valuable feedback.

Please keep the Starry Starry Night thanksgiving event on Thursday 24th November in your calendar. The children are looking forward to sharing something special with their families on this night.



The Flanders poppy became accepted throughout the allied nations as the flower of remembrance to be worn on Armistice Day. The red poppies were among the first plants that sprouted from the devastation of the battlefields of northern France and Belgium. Wearing poppies helps us show our respect for those who have died.

Each year, we gather at 11am on the 11th day of the 11th month, and pause to reflect, to give honour to the memories of those who have died for their country.

Year 4/5/6 News

In 4/5/6 this week we have been focusing on finishing our assessment tasks for Term 4. We all cannot believe how fast this Term has gone and that there are only 2 weeks left of school. We have all made stars for the "One Million Stars to End Violence" campaign lead by the Community Centre. These stars will be collected and then displayed at the 2018 Commonwealth Games at the Gold Coast. Miss Jade taught us two weeks ago how to make them and whilst the stars were tricky at first, we now have it down to a fine art and can make them very quickly.

Year 1 News

This week in year one students began Reading Eggs on the iPads and laptops and have been progressing at their own individual levels. We each planned a Recount by working out who, what, when, where and why we go to swimming lessons at the pool. We then completed a written Recount using our plan. We drew diagrams about how vibration causes sound waves that travel through the air to our ears. We talked about how light reflects in order for us to see it and wrote about why a place can be either light or dark. We drew three different patterns that were growing in size or number and repeating in colours. We have begun to practise a class song for the whole school Starry Starry Night event.

We respectfully observed a two minute silence for Remembrance Day.

Physical Education

The students have been busily finishing off Semester 2 Units this week and have been working on their assessment pieces.
