

## PRINCIPAL MESSAGE

Dear Families,

A warm welcome to Term Three at St Joseph's!

I sincerely hope that all families enjoyed the two-week break from school and that everyone's energy levels have been recharged. It is my pleasure to also welcome the Ah Shay (Evan Prep), West (Jay Year 3) and Hynes (Jessica Year 2) families into our community. I would also like to welcome Mrs Emily Haardt to our staff. Emily will be the Year 4/5/6 teacher for the remainder of the year, replacing Kirsty Vass who finished up at the end of Term 2. Mrs Melanie Turner will move to a Specialist teaching role as the PE and SEL teacher on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. Please note that PE lessons will now occur for all students on Wednesdays.

The school site has been a busy hive of activity over the past two weeks. The Playground equipment has finally been installed over the holidays and looks fabulous. All the classrooms have been given a little facelift with a deep clean of the classroom floors by Cath our cleaning lady. I am very pleased to welcome staff and students back today to settle into these spaces. I am very grateful to Aaron and his team from Weipa Cabinets for his scheduling of the work over the break.

Unfortunately, the works for the installation of irrigation and turf for the oval has been delayed due to waiting on materials to arrive in Weipa to complete the water mains and pump works necessary for the irrigation functioning. This is a delay due to our remote location and ability to get the required parts here in Weipa, a very 'Weipa' occurrence I understand so our patience is needed for just a bit longer.

A highlight of Term 3 each year is the celebration of Catholic Education Week. This year's theme is Opening the Doors in the Year of Mercy. Celebrations will reflect the Year of Mercy, drawing on the symbolism that Catholic Schools open doors for students in a holistic sense. The theme also challenges us to extend tangible assistance to those in need and to recognise and follow the example of those who in some way open doors for others. When I think about people opening doors for others, the first thing that comes to mind is the work of Mary MacKillop, one of St Joseph's patron saints. Mary devoted her whole life work to opening the doors of education and health for children of Australia, especially in outback and remote locations. I draw your attention to the reminder notice of the holiday next Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> July on which the school will be closed. As you all know and would have experienced in the past, the community of Weipa took the Cairns show holiday as a local holiday in Weipa as well. Last October when we were setting dates and calendars for the 2016 school year we unaware of the plan to change this for the community of Weipa and so the 22<sup>nd</sup> July was gazetted in our system calendar as a local holiday in our school year. We only became aware of the holiday being changed in March this year once we were well into Term One. After seeking advice from our Catholic Education Office we were instructed that for this year only we would keep the Cairns Show holiday. Next year we will only acknowledge the local Fishing Competition holiday for the June long weekend.

Training and preparations are well under way for our first Athletics Carnival next Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> July. Please see the information enclosed with further detail of procedures for the day.

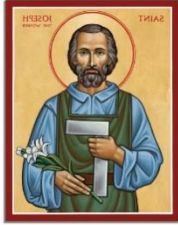

9.00am First event

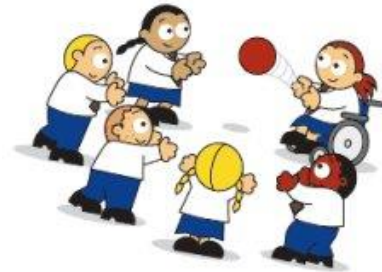
11.00am Capeaccino crew will attend
