Everyone is talking about the growth mind-set (the idea that you can grow your abilities by believing you can) versus the fixed mind-set and most seem to agree that developing students with a growth mind-set is highly desirable.

Put very simply, Carol Dweck, the mastermind behind this hot button concept, informs us that if we praise intelligence we raise the fear of failure and aid in developing students with a fixed mind-set.

However, if we acknowledge effort we improve a student's ability to apply it and in turn facilitate the development of a growth mind-set.

Some are cherry picking Dweck's ideas and research to arrive at the notion that developing the growth mind-set requires little more than praising children for their effort.

Alfie Kohn has gone to some lengths to help educators steer clear of this erroneous, perhaps even dangerous, idea. (See further reading at the end of this article)

My experience is that teachers acknowledging effort do little more than praise it. Consequently, unwarranted and superlative laden praise merely shifts from being about the child's performance and person (Brilliant spelling! You are amazing!) to include an additional remark about effort (Wow! What a sensational effort!)

St. Joseph was the foster father of Jesus on Earth. He took care of Jesus

and the Blessed Virgin Mary and taught Jesus to work as a carpenter. St. Joseph was declared a saint before the canonization process officially started in the 12th century. He is so special and such a powerful intercessor that he has TWO feast days in the church calendar: March 19th (Feast of St. Joseph) and May 1st (St. Joseph the Worker). He has been declared as the patron of the Universal Church, and he is also the patron saint of carpenters, the dying, people in doubt, and those trying to sell their homes amongst others. "Ite ad Joseph!" is Latin for "Go to Joseph!" Let us always remember this special saint who took on raising the Son of God along with the Blessed Virgin Mary!

HEAD LICE

In recent years the incidence of head lice in schools has been increasing. Children suffering from head lice are not normally excluded. On discovery of an infestation, parents are advised to treat the problem immediately and to check hair regularly to prevent reinfestation. Parents will be informed by letter or newsletter if any child in the class has head lice. It is important to note that head lice are not caused by unhygienic conditions, and can be caught by anyone regardless of the cleanliness of the hair. It is therefore important to be vigilant in checking your child's hair regularly, especially if they have an itchy scalp. Long hair should be tied up.
