Working in a remote location such as Weipa provides significant challenge as a school leader. At the heart of all I administer is the core business of any good school and that is to ensure optimal wellbeing and the highest quality teaching and learning for all students. For St Joseph's, Weipa our goal is to offer the students and families of Weipa an educational opportunity equal to any they would receive in any regional or capital city.

There is, of course, the formal teaching and learning practices that happen around the school and in the classrooms every day, such as Liturgy, prayer and Religion lessons. Much more than that though, is what we 'do' at St Joseph's which is solidly based within the Gospel values that make us uniquely St Joseph's Weipa. This is what students experience every day. Our responsible choices – positive behaviours system, Social emotional learning and Play Is the Way programs shape much of our school culture. 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


Last week I also started reporting on the results from our School Results surveys and what it indicates in relation to the level of satisfaction received in each area of the survey. For participation in the survey we achieved:

- 82.4% of students who recorded an overall satisfaction score of 81%.

Below is a breakdown of the key areas that were surveyed and the growth from September 2017 to August 2018 by all stakeholders. For students it was recorded that in all key areas there was an average growth of 2% which is a great result and the key below indicates the level of satisfaction received in each graph.

STUDENTS AS STAKEHOLDERS AT ST JOSEPH'S.




Again, this shows the growth from September 2017 to August 2018 from our student body and the overall average growth was 2%.

"friendliness and welcoming attitude by staff."






