Dear Parents,

It is lovely to be back in Weipa and greeted so warmly by everyone at St Joseph's. My time away on professional renewal leave was spent mainly in France and Italy. One of the most lasting experiences and a definite highlight was the time spent in northern France staying in a little village just near the Australian war memorial at Villiers Brettoneau. I was able to visit my uncle's grave and pay tribute to the sacrifice he made for my family. One of the most deeply moving experiences was the time spent in the John Monash centre at Villiers Brettoneau. I left the Monash centre with a deep sense humility for all the beautiful young men who gave their life for their country and feeling so proud of the freedom and life I have been able to live as a result of their sacrifice.



There is a school in the village nearby, which is called the Victoria school in tribute to the soldiers and support of Australia during the first world war.



Like many of the villages along the western front which display flags and signs saying "we will never forget the Australians". I will never forget them.

Yesterday was the final day of our 2019 Prep transition. Acknowledgement and credit must go to our wonderful Prep teacher Miss Andreika Knight for her coordination of this transition program. The program has been slightly changed from previous years and from all accounts it has enhanced the benefit of this program for children parents and St Joseph's school.

I also wish to thank the school leadership team who in my absence led many of the Prep parent information sessions each week. Yesterday I spoke to our incoming families around the importance early years learning, and specifically the emphasis we place on 'learning to read' in P -2 which then sets our students well on the

During guided reading we are teaching the students about the four jobs of a reader:

First job - lift the words off the page and put them in your brain Second job - read really fast, read like a river, not like a robot

Third job - know what the words mean and put them in your suitcase - CLICK

Fourth job - Now here's the MAGIC - understanding what you read TAAADAHHH!

We are also placing a high focus on retelling the text which includes the main events (beginning, middle and end). During writing we continue to practice using the correct punctuation and sounding-out using the learnt phonograms.

We will continue with Phonological Awareness. (Rhyming, syllables, initial, phoneme isolation which can be initial, medial or final).

Mathematics:

Establish understanding of the language and processes of counting by naming numbers in sequence, initially to and from 20, moving from any starting point.

Represent practical situations to model addition and sharing.

Continue with days of the week and months of the year.

Religion:

Will know about the Nativity Story as part of Christian Christmas Celebrations

Year 1. Only two weeks to go until the end the year and then all of the students are in year two. For the past two weeks the year ones have been very busy finishing off assessment tasks. In English, they have been writing a poem and focusing on reading a passage as fast as they could, using a timer to time themselves. In Mathematics, we have been revising graphing and skip counting. Next week, we say goodbye to Lilla and wish her well.

We had a visit from the local police to talk about safety, wearing a seatbelt in the car, wearing a helmet on a bike and lots more. The students each got a sticker and a book to colour in all about being safe. This week was our last week to borrow books from the Library so can all library books please be returned by next Thursday.

Year 2. This week we have focused on the push of water and the pull of gravity. We have conducted

experiments to consolidate their learning.

In Religion we learnt about the "Good Samaritan" story in the Bible.

We have also concentrated on the sounds "igh" and "eigh"

Year 3. Year 3 have been learning all about 3D objects in maths. We learnt some new words to help us

describe properties of the 3D objects and we all made our own 3D object with small toothpicks and play dough.

We have finished off the History unit learning all about continuity and change in different communities. The class learnt about how schools have changed, as well as how entertainment and transport has changed and stayed the same over time. We have also worked our way through the Daniel Morcombe unit, learning all about how to keep ourselves safe and how to recognise and react if we do find ourselves in an unsafe situation.

Year 4. What a fortnight of assessment. The Year 4 will definitely deserve a break after the week they have had. We have had a focus with our Civics on rules and laws. The students had to create a new rule and then went through the process of a representative presenting this to the class. We all then had the opportunity to vote like everyday Australians do and decided on the one rule we wanted to abide by. So far everyone is following the rules. Our knowledge of fractions and angles have improved over the past week or so. We will continue to review a variety of maths concepts until the end of the year. This week we were assigned to school prayer and the students showed their acting skills while performing The Good Samaritan. Kindness has been a focus for us for a short while. We want to finish off on the year with many positive notes by hearing about the kind things our school community are doing.

Year 5. What an exciting fortnight! Year 5 were privileged to be able to be the leaders of the school in week 5 while year 6 were away on camp. I am very proud to say that overall they stepped up to the challenge. Their dedication to practising for assembly and bravery to speak in front of the school for our Remembrance Day prayer service is to be commended. They are showing the maturity required to lead these important school events next year.

In English, we have learned about different types of poems, including shape poems, limericks, odes and ballads. Students are now in the process of analysing a given poem and constructing their own poems using structural elements, figurative language and sound devices. Those who have completed their homework have certainly noticed how this has supported them with their poetry interpretations and writing in class. Well done to those students!

In Maths, we completed our probability unit about probability trees. We are now doing a short measurement and geometry unit on area and perimeter. We have completed our Religion unit about Mother Mary by writing Marian prayers.

Science has brought us many opportunities to experiment with light and shadows. We now know how to make a use periscopes! We are all salivating when we learn about French foods and drinks and look forward to our French meal later in the term. We have started our "All For One and One For All" Civics and Citizenship unit where we are learning about how groups can have a positive effect on bringing social change to the world and the students are very engaged in this subject matter.

Year 6. Year 6 have had a sensational couple of weeks! Our School Camp was a success, with students developing independence, making brave decisions, and challenging themselves. Students visited Parliament House and the Science Centre. They also challenged themselves by zip-lining and building rafts sturdy enough to travel the lake. This week we have been creating a School Camp scrapbook to build upon this experience and consolidate our mapping skills, writing skills, and vocabulary.
