Dear Parents and Carers,

Another very busy week here at school with lots of visitors from our Catholic Education Office as well as the Building Grants Committee from QCEC to assess our building proposal for Stage 2. The Grants committee were here yesterday to assess and approve funds for a further 2 classrooms, some additional admin space and the extension of the Flexible Learning space. Thank you to Donna Machin, our P & F president for representing our parent body at this meeting. Donna's input gave valuable parent and community insight to the committee on the establishment of the school in Weipa.

This Monday night 16th May our Parents and Friends association meet at 7pm in the Multi -purpose room. I encourage all parents to come along to this first meeting which is crucial to setting priorities for the school P 8 F over the next 12 months. It is important that the P & F hear the voice of all the parent community as these priorities are determined and sub committees are formed. I will also present an update to the P & F at this meeting of the Stage 2 building proposal as well as the construction of playground equipment and the turfing of the oval.

It would be lovely to have many of you present to acknowledge and celebrate this very significant day in the establishment of our beautiful new school. NAPLAN

Our students have now completed all of 4 NAPLAN tests set down for this year. On Tuesday the students sat the Language Conventions and Writing tests, Wednesday they completed the Reading test, and Thursday the Numeracy test. Children are to be congratulated for the manner in which they approached this compulsory aspect of school life knowing that they gave their very best effort on the day of testing.

Cross Country

As advised last week our School Cross Country will be held Friday the 27th May within the school grounds. The day will commence for students from 8am. It is hoped that class rolls will all be marked by 8.30 so that children can participate in House war cries at 8.40am. Students will be given the opportunity to walk the track before our first event at approximately 9am.

Students should wear full sports uniform, including a hat and bring plenty of water.

If any parents are available to help out on the day, your support would be most welcome. Medals for our winners and runners-up will be handed out the following Friday at assembly.





Prep News

Preps had an important lesson on cyber safety when using the internet with Miss Grant in the multipurpose room. Preps learnt about the importance of not sharing passwords and not clicking on messages that might pop up suddenly. Preps are further developing their movement and ball skills in Hpe. Activities cover a variety of skills including throwing, catching and bouncing.

The class investigated and identified things that they can see that are made by God when walking around our school. Photographs were taken of the grass, trees, sky, clouds, dirt, pebbles and leaves.

The preps are enjoying reading groups with parent helpers. They are listening to a variety of books. Preps say thank you to those who are able to come in and help.

Year 1 News

In Year One this week, a number of students enthusiastically started cross country training. In class we have been learning about Narratives and how they have a setting, characters and events. We had an African story told to us by Miss Edem. This story included how water can be carried in containers that are balanced on a child or adult's head. We had a Cyber safety lesson with Miss Grant who taught about the importance of confidentiality of our personal passwords. In the Arts, we made some different types of shape monsters for the Book fair.

Year 2 News

As a class we have had to settle back into routine and revisit our class rules and School Covenant so that we are all respecting each other and the way each student works. We are learning about how every person is different, that we all learn in a variety of ways and enjoy different aspects of school.
