Praying a decade consists of – The Sign of the Cross, 1 Our Father, 10 Hail Marys, 1 Glory be to the Father and finishing with the Sign of the Cross. During the month of October, let us consider this beautiful prayer of the Rosary as a means that we too can use in order to draw closer to Jesus and Mary by meditating on the great mysteries of our salvation.

### Prep News

Preps have been thoroughly engaged in measurement activities this week in Maths. They estimate how long they think something is then use informal units to measure a variety of items around school. The Preps are now very good at sharing number facts for friends of ten and can more readily identify the different ways to make ten. Preps played Alligator in the Swamp and Sharks and Sardines in sport this week. They thoroughly enjoyed these games with Mrs Turner while they developed team skills and game strategies. In Religion, they learnt about the Rosary and Rosary beads as a special way to pray. The Preps did well supporting Crazy Sock Day. They learnt that the money raised will go to help those in need through the work of the missions.

### Year 1 News

This week in year one we researched photographs of transport vehicles and clothing from the past in Britannica. We located different countries on Google Earth. In Science we listened to a story that described different sounds and then identified the source of these sounds. We worked on number lines, analogue time and the value of Australian coins in Maths. We explored rhyming words, rhythm and beat in poems. We combined with Prep for a lesson on how we recognise and respond to different emotions. We looked forward to swimming throughout the week and enjoyed our second lesson.

Our big achievement this week was completing our BFG character document in Google Drive and learning how to Share it to Miss Libby's email address so she could print it off. This involved quite a few steps: patience, listening skills, following directions and then putting it all together. The class were very patient as we had internet issues and Mrs Grant and I were impressed with how well the students coped with all the instructions. So we now have a completed **Yr 2 BFG book** which will be coming home to each family over the next few weeks. We hope you enjoy it! The students have been also learning 2x multiplication and we enjoyed collaborative activities to help us consolidate our understanding of groups, arrays and what multiplication means. This has been another busy week with our involvement with the Lego Robotics. Swimming and practicing our dance assessment pieces. For our dance assessment pieces.
