PRINCIPAL MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Thank you to everyone for making our Opening Day a resounding success on Tuesday morning. This week I share with you the address I gave on Friday as way of saying thank you to all our community.

Good Morning and welcome Bishop James, Mr Bill Dixon, parents and friends, our guests, staff and most importantly our foundation students. It is lovely to share in this long awaited but very much blessed occasion.

Almost exactly twelve months ago I stepped off the Qantas flight from Cairns to visit Weipa for the first time whilst considering the Principalship for a new school being built at Weipa. What I saw when I stepped off the plane was a landscape that was all very familiar to me, the red earth and low scrub surrounding the airport. Shortly afterwards I was here in Weipa experiencing for myself the friendliness of the locals and the welcome of a community eager for their new school to open its doors.

On that first visit the school was just some concrete footing poured into a thick powder of red dust. The lovely crisp white bunting that went up on the perimeter fence displaying the artist's impression of the finished school was soon too, a lovely shade of orange/red.

From those very early days, I sensed a deep appreciation from the community that finally the school that the community had been advocating for many years was coming to fruition.

Whilst I can be the person who stands here today on behalf of the school, I stand here to speak for and of the wonderful and energetic people who helped the school become what you see today.

The Parish community: your tireless work in supporting an idea and your continued support and encouragement to this day as we forge a united parish community mindful of church and school.

To the team of Catholic Education Services Cairns: the amazing foresight of our Catholic Education Services team in setting up all the necessary framework and support systems for St Joseph's to function. I feel privileged to work for an organization that puts the needs of people first. This evident in the support we have particularly in the recruitment and relocation of staff to Weipa. On the days when I thought there was no way something could be done, until a phone call to the right personnel enabled a resolution to be found.

The Steering committee: You were the A team, the glue that kept everything going as you were the link between the Weipa community and the Catholic Ed Services as well a wonderful support to me personally in those first few months when I was here by myself.

Architects and builders: The concept of creating a 21st century learning space in probably one of the most remote locations was fraught with challenges. The beautiful learning spaces we have today are testament to understanding of the task you were given. I would also like to acknowledge the generosity of the numerous local businesses that have assisted us with everything from furniture and electrical equipment, form plumbing to electrical repairs

The parents: Your belief and trust in seeing on paper in a very tiny office last year what we visioned for your children.

The students: Your joy as you turn up every day to school for a brand new day of learning.

And last but not least the amazing team of staff that I have gathered here to help me at St Joseph's. Your professionalism and fantastic team work is a delight to come to work each day. From the very early days when the Alby was my daily work space juggling a laptop on a table in the corner trying to get internet connection, to the tiny office space that Jenni and I shared side by side during 50 enrolment interviews. I have been greeted happily every day, a joke and a laugh made of the utterly ridiculous and always a positive, never say die attitude to start again the next day.

Together you all enable us to 'bring faith and learning to life' every day for the children in our care.

The reflection of the readings from Mass last Sunday for Pentecost spoke of opening doors, letting the Holy Spirit into our lives, our hearts and our homes. I truly believe that we here at St Joseph's have witnessed a unique and vibrant spirit develop in our school. A spirit, which truly does embody the mission of our catholic heritage where we strive to live out each day with humility, justice and compassion in all we do.

I feel proud and privileged to lead this very special family oriented school community.

News from the APRE

I would like to extend a very special thank you to all those who have helped or attended our Official opening on Tuesday. It was another special time for all of us here at St Joseph's and it was wonderful to show our amazing school off to all the visitors. Bishop James, Ernest Madua Jnr and others were extremely impressed with what we have managed to achieve in such a short space of time and what a wonderful community we have at St Joseph's.

Cross country will be held next Friday and there will be lots of information being distributed via newsletter and the Facebook page. Please make sure you have checked these and Mrs Vass will be seeking volunteer parents for Station Marshalls for the morning.

At the assembly today I spoke to the children about the safety of themselves and others when collecting their bikes of an afternoon. I have asked that students who are cycling to school to leave through the staffed gate. They are not allowed to leave without their parent if they are in attendance to collect them from school and bikes must be walked through the Drop, Stop, and Go zone.

AFL on Wednesday afternoons has started and it was lovely to see so many attending, but we were not sure if parents were aware that this is not a school organised event, so an adult must be present with your child when attending these skills sessions.

Next Tuesday all grades from Prep to Year 6 will be listening to a Child Safety Presentation by the Queensland Child Safety Ambassadors, Denise and Bruce Morcombe. This will begin at 9am in the flexible learning space. Parents are most welcome to attend. The presentation lasts for approximately 50 minutes which includes a short film.

Just a gentle reminder about our before school procedures. The children are not permitted to be in classrooms unless their teacher is present and are certainly not allowed on verandas or in the sports area. They are to sit on the seats outside the flexible learning space until duty commences at 8.20am. We have staff prayer each Thursday at 8.10am and teachers are not available unless t is an emergency.


