#### PRINCIPAL MESSAGE

Dear Parents,

Thank you to the children and families that came along to represent St Joseph's at the Anzac day memorial dawn service, I'm sure parents, like me, were very proud to see the children in uniform marching as a school group for the first time.

I am heading to Brisbane this weekend for an early Mother's day with my daughters. I have a sneaking suspicion that there is mischief afoot in something they have planned. This reminds me of a friend of mine that has developed a wonderful parenting strategy which she calls the "Look." I have seen her use it to great effect with her teenage sons. It requires practice but, once perfected, it reduces unnecessary conversations, painful negotiations and almost always results in action. She believes that anyone wearing glasses has an added advantage as they tend to magnify the eyes and hence, the Look. Failure to perfect this manoeuvre before using it on unsuspecting offspring can render them helpless with laughter, as you do tend to look like a cross between a character in a low budget horror movie and one of the Three Stooges. So practise it in the bathroom mirror until perfected.

I share this snippet of personal information after reading about the latest bestselling parenting book, "French Parents Don't Give In," by Pamela Druckerman. She suggests a long list of parenting strategies, a few of which I share with you. She is also a champion of the Look strategy, which in French translates as "les gros yeux" or "the fat eyes." Some of her wise suggestions are as follows:

- At mealtimes everyone eats the same thing
- You choose the foods; your child chooses how much
- Extracurricular activities are for pleasure, not competitive advantage
- Give children meaningful chores
- Show children you have a life apart from them
- On matters of discipline, never contradict your partner in front of the children
- Punish rarely, but make it count and don't raise a praise addict

It promises to be an entertaining and thoughtful read.

So hop to it and start practising the "Look" or, as my kids would say, the "Teacher's Stare." A word to the wise, take your sunglasses off first!

### Parent Info - Kiss n Ride Rules

Kiss n Ride and No Parking zones operate under the same conditions- parents may stop to drop off or pick up children for a maximum of 2 minutes. If you need longer time, please park elsewhere.

The Driver must remain within 3 metres of the vehicle Rules apply only within hours displayed.

Under no circumstances are you to overtake another vehicle in this zone.

Kiss n Ride zone is for your child's safety, your convenience, and to minimise congestion and confusion.

- Stay in Sequence!
