Strong family/school partnership is one of the hallmarks of our school and I look forward to seeing many parents at the Parent Information Night taking place this Tuesday evening, 7th February for Year 3,5, 6 and Thursday 9th February for Years P ,1, 2 and 4 starting at 5pm . Early, regular and personal communication really does make a difference to that partnership. I thank the many parents who have already made contact with their child's classroom teacher to discuss particular learning needs for their children.

Should you be unable to attend the night's information session, please make another appropriate time to meet with your child's class teacher for any important information regarding classroom procedures and routines. Class teachers will provide a Term Overview of what is happening for their class this term.

What constitutes Bullying?

Quite often, we hear students describing behaviours at school as "bullying". This has sparked a great discussion among our school staff as many children can quickly label behaviours as bullying when in fact it is not bullying.

Dr Ken Rigby (in Working Together: A toolkit for effective school based action against bullying, 2010. P.6) defines bullying "as a systematic and repeated abuse of power. In general bullying may be defined as:

- Dominating or hurting someone;
- Unfair action by the perpetrator and an imbalance of power

The Queensland Schools Alliance against Violence Working Together Toolkit (2010. P. 6-7) identifies five types of bullying:

1. Physical Bullying

When a person (or group of people) uses actions to bully, such as hitting, poking, tripping or pushing

Repeatedly and intentionally damaging someone's belongings is also physical bullying.

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2. Verbal Bullying

Repeated or systematic name calling, insults, homophobic or racist remarks and verbal abuse.

3. Covert Bullying

Such as lying about someone, spreading rumours, playing a nasty joke that make the person feel humiliated or powerless, mimicking or deliberately excluding someone.

4. Psychological Bullying

Examples include threatening, manipulating or stalking someone.

5. Cyber Bullying

Using technology, such as email, mobile phones, chat rooms, social networking sites to bully verbally, socially or psychologically.

The following behaviours **DO NOT** constitute bullying:

- Mutual arguments and disagreements (where there is no power imbalance)
- Not liking someone or a single act of social rejection
- One-off acts of meanness, intimidation or violence

While these behaviours would not be constituted as bullying (because they do not involve deliberate and repeated harm and a power imbalance), they need to be addressed in the same way as other inappropriate student behaviours. 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Classroom News..

Prep



In Prep this week we continued learning about the St Josephs' Covenant and our routines and transitions, including keeping our hats in the top pocket of our bags for easy location. We have been exploring how words and illustrations add meaning in texts, as well as understanding that we can express likes and dislikes about stories using language. One of the stories we have read this week is called *The Very Blue Thingamajig* by Narelle Oliver. We have been learning to make quantities with concrete materials and order numbers from the smallest to the largest. We talked about what people need to stay alive including water, air/oxygen, food and shelter. We learnt how to throw underarm with direction, using mini beanbags and continued our Reading Eggs program on the IPads. We joined in with the whole school for a visit from the Cowboys team who talked with us about the importance of respect.

Year 1

Each week for English we will read a picture book that will be our focus book for the week. We will read the book a few times over the week to understand the meaning of some tricky words. This week our book was called "Big Rain Coming". The students have enjoyed this picture book, as they have been able to watch the clouds build up in the afternoon, just as they do in the story. In mathematics, our focus has been counting in 2's, 5's and 10's and looking at numbers that come before and after a chosen number. I am super excited to see what next week will bring!

Year 2

What an exhausting week! So many new things to learn and remember. We have continued to talk about being bucket fillers and children now have their own real bucket to be filled. We have started our 'Star of the Day' student and setting daily goals every morning has helped us focus on positive choices and behaviour in class. We absolutely loved playing Snakes and Ladders in PTW and BUZZ in class. Our maths learning was adding multiples of 10 on a hundreds board and we blitzed it. I would like to thank every child for making my birthday on Wednesday so special and thank the many parents who spoilt me!
