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Classroom News..



Prep.

We've had a great first week of Term 3. We celebrated NAIDOC week this week, which began with a whole school Liturgy. Throughout the week we participated in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultural activities including singing, weaving, games, clay tile and damper making. We made Dharis using the colours of the Torres Strait Islands' flag. On Wednesday, our class joined with visitors from Napranum and C & K kindergartens here at school for some games and morning tea. We began an outdoor Perceptual Motor Program (PMP) with Year One this week. The students learnt some songs this week which were sung at the Kup Mari event on Thursday night. At the end of the week we went on a bus trip to Hibberd Park where we celebrated Under 8's day with games and fun filled activities with the rest of the Weipa Community.





Year 1 ..

Can you believe we are in Week One of Term 3, wow! We are half way through the year already. This week has been very busy. We have celebrated NAIDOC week participating in a NAIDOC Liturgy, weaving with coconut palms, making damper and creating a tile using clay. The children have had a wonderful week participating in all of these activities. As well, we have been focusing in English on how we have been at school for 100 days this year and the children have had to write what they have learnt in 100 days of school. Today, the children participated in under 8's day in the park participating in a variety of activities. Next week, the children will have Mrs. K on Thursday and Friday, as Miss Henderson has to travel to Cairns for some PD. This term homework will start in week 2 and be due every Friday. Our Library day will stay as Friday, so everything is due on a Friday and hopefully this will make things easier.

If any parent is available in the mornings from 8:40-9:00am we will continue with reading in the flexible learning area.

Year 2 ..

What an exciting week we have had! Our first day back from holidays we welcomed a new student Peta-Rose who has settled in so well, and our student teacher Miss K who has been delightful in class and taken on many lessons with the students. We all enjoy listening to everyone's adventures over the holidays and I am amazed at what so many families pack into a holiday!

What an inspiring NAIDOC celebration we have experienced: from tile making, weaving, damper making and learning sign language and songs to the wonderful Kup Mari last night. I can see how much the students benefit from these experiences, encouraging inclusiveness and celebrating indigenous culture and story. We have been reading many dreaming stories this week as part of NAIDOC week. Today our Under 8's day was super fun and enjoyed by all. Everyone will need a good rest this weekend!

Year 3 ..

It's been a very busy first week back with NAIDOC weaving, damper making, singing and dancing and learning to sign our songs. Mrs Saunders has been away this week so Mrs Bienvenu has been filling in with Ms Cass. In English we're starting our information reports and in Maths we've been practising our multiplication facts. In Science this term we're focussing on space and in HASS we're looking at civics and citizenship's law and order. On Friday we enjoyed going to Under 8s day and playing with all the kids.

Year 4 ..

This week Year 4 have been enjoying NAIDOC activities, including weaving, beading, damper making, tile decoration, and learning Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander songs and dances. We also learnt why this years' theme of "Our Languages Matter" is very important. In Maths we have been focusing on multiplication and the specific language of multiplication – rows, groups and product. Mrs Haardt brought back some exciting new books from the English conference she attended as well as some prizes! Our novel focus for the first couple of weeks for the Term will be on short stories written by Andy Griffiths, these will form the inspiration for us to write our own short stories. Our writing focus will be on narratives and learning to engage our audience when writing stories. We started out Religion unit this morning, focusing on "What is Community?" Year 4 will be involved in Science days this Term, where we will spend the whole day learning about Science skills and knowledge. There will be some home activities that you will be notified about in the coming weeks.

Year 5 - 6 ..

Welcome to Narnia! This week we started reading "The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe" by C.S. Lewis. We also started thinking about the definition of Poetry so that later this term we can write our own in the form of song lyrics! In Maths, we have been looking at 3D shapes. Year 5s have been focusing on how to connect these to their nets and Year 6 have been looking at how to make these shapes. The students did a great job creating their family trees in French so that later this term they can produce a poster about special events that they've celebrated with their family. All students thoroughly enjoyed this week's NAIDOC activities. Weaving was an overwhelming favourite and our prayer table is now home to some very impressive coconut leaf crosses. Year 5/6 would like to thank Miss Tari, the School Officers and all other helpers for putting together such incredible activities.
