

No doubt, you are aware of the Federal Governments push to overhaul school funding. Mr Bill Dixon (our Executive Director) has drafted a response and we have been asked to forward this to our community. A separate email was forwarded to all families yesterday.

From next Semester all reports will be uploaded to the parent portal. The portal will have a number of different functions and we would like to be able to start sharing and using them so we can streamline and make our days a little easier. More information will be sent out in Term 3.

School starts again on Monday July 10 with Tuesday July 11 being the show holiday. Dates for Term Three have been added to the calendar on the parent portal and we will continue to update this.

NAIDOC Week celebrations are well under way for week one next term and I encourage all members of our school community to purchase a ticket and attend our wonderful celebrations. So start collecting from Wednesday 26th July.



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
