Reports

It's reporting time once again and quite often school reports can mean anxious times for parents and students. Children of all ages take their cues from their parents, so your reaction to their school report can affect the way they see themselves as learners and as people. When you open the school report do you look for strengths or weaknesses first?

The challenge is to focus on strengths rather than focus purely on areas that need improving. Take into account your child's effort and attitude to learning. If the report indicates that effort is below standard then you and your child have something to work on. If your child is putting in the required effort then you can't ask any more than that regardless of the grading. Broaden your focus away from academic performance to form a picture of how your child is progressing as an individual in a social setting.

The skills of independence and cooperation are highly rated by employers these days so don't dismiss these as unimportant. Discuss the report with your son or daughter talking about their strengths first before looking at areas needing improvement. Ask for their opinion about how they performed and discuss their concerns.

After reports are read and discussed celebrate your children's efforts with a special activity or treat. In this way you will recognise progress and remind them that holidays are just around the corner when they can forget about assessment, tests and reports for a while. *(Adapted from 'Parenting Ideas')*

All families are reminded that from this semester all report cards will be uploaded to the Parent Portal so please check your emails from last week as the instructions were sent out to inform you on how to set up your username and passwords.

If you are having any problems with this process, please let the office know as soon as possible.

Next week we will farewell our Year 6 students, any families leaving us on their new journeys and the last day of our school year. Father Dariusz will be here from Thursday to help us celebrate these occasions so I would like to take this opportunity to invite you all along to the final liturgy for the year.

It will be held in the church on Friday at 9 am and afterwards the students will return to classes until 12 noon when school will cease for 2017.

Next week I will also place some information into the newsletter with regards to Advent. Advent marks the beginning of the new liturgical year and this year it begins on Sunday 3rd December. Year 4... This week in Year 4 we have been practising our writing by creating letters of thanks to people serving our country overseas. In Maths we have been problem solving and using our number sense to predict, calculate and prove our solutions. In Science we reviewed our key concepts and drew together our knowledge of energy in a letter format. We are in full swing of practising our Starry Starry Night performance. The children are encouraged to think of something their recipient would really like and share the Christmas spirit.


