Pope Francis offered a 17-year-old boy with Downs Syndrome a very rare privilege during his general audience on Wednesday - a personal tour of the 'Popemobile'. Pope Francis invited Alberto di Tullio, 17, up onto his open-top Mercedes at the end of his general audience on Wednesday while tens of thousands of people looked on.

The boy's father, Celestino di Tullio, told reporters how he choked up when Francis approached his son. He said the Pope saw him and embraced him. When the boy pointed to the car, the Pope invited him up.

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This week we begin the celebration of Holy Week which begins with Palm Sunday, the day Jesus triumphantly enters into Jerusalem. This year, we are able to celebrate the events of Holy week together before setting off on the holidays.

What is Holy Week?

Holy week begins with Passion or Palm Sunday which was last Sunday 25th March. During Holy Week we are called to enter this time with reverence and celebrate its rites with care and devotion.



Holy Thursday – Maundy Thursday 29th March is the celebration of the Lord’s Supper. At the mass of the Lord’s Supper the focus is on the celebration of the Eucharist and what happened.

Good Friday – 30th March is the day we remember the passion and death of Christ on the cross. It is usually a solemn day and when the celebration finishes with the prayer over the people. Catholics should abstain from eating meat on Good Friday.

Easter Sunday 1st April is the most significant day in the Easter celebration for Catholics. We celebrate the saving love and new life given to us through the resurrection of Jesus.

ANZAC DAY Celebrations.

In Term 2 we will see an important focus on celebrating and remembering the ANZACs and all who have served their country. The human qualities of mateship, courage and sacrifice are associated with the spirit of the ANZACs and proudly embraced as a part of our National Identity. 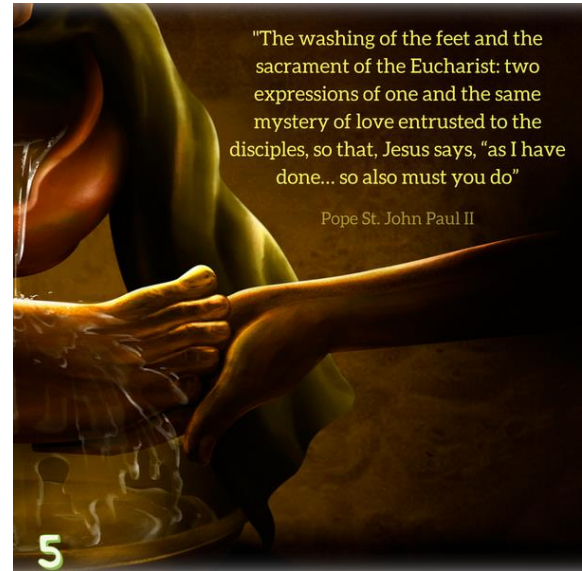

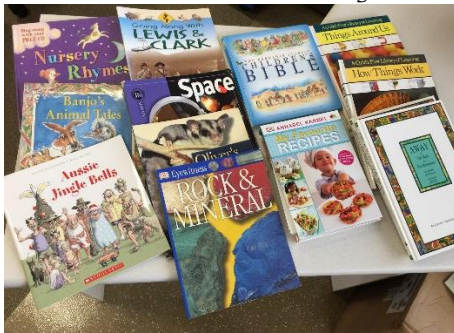

Library News

Everyone at St Joseph's would like to thank the Weipa Community Centre for their massive book donation. There is definitely some excited children looking forward to getting their hands on these.



We would also like to remind the parents about the book swap located in the Library. Feel free to come and have a look anytime.



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Prep.. In Prep we have been explicitly teaching the correct letter formation for each letter of the alphabet. We are continuing to practice the following reading strategies; looking at the pictures, sounding out or decoding unfamiliar words and rereading. Before reading the book, we are predicting what the story might be about as well. We are continuing to revise; the letter sounds, syllables, rhyming, segmenting and blending and writing simple sentences.

In Mathematics we focussed on simple addition and are continuing with: counting forward by 1's, counting backwards from 20 by 1's. Counting a collection with the 1:1 connection and matching numerals, quantity, symbols and the words (0-20). We are also subitizing (recognising an amount without counting), sorting objects into groups and reading single digit and two-digit numbers. Representing concrete materials of single digit and two-digit numbers. Creating and continuing patterns.

In PMP we are continuing with; balancing, hopping, jumping and pointing to our body parts such as knees, elbows and toes. We have introduced skipping, throwing and catching.

In Religion we have been focussing on the Easter Story. We looked at the Stations of The Cross and discussed some of the events that happened at each station.

Year 1.. We have reached the end of Term One! What an eventful term we have had. I wish you all a safe and enjoyable Easter Holiday break. For the past week, the Year Ones have participated in the Cross Country. We have finished our History presentations, learnt some more sounds, focused on some rhyming words and we have continued to learn about verbs. We have been singing some nursery rhymes to help with our fine motor skills. As well, in Maths, we have been focusing on place value and counting.

This week being Holy Week, we have discussed the importance of Holy Week. We all attended a liturgy about Palm Sunday and discussed the stations of the cross- what happened to Jesus before and after Easter Sunday. We have discussed that Easter is not just about enjoying all of the chocolate Easter eggs. As part of Holy Week we had the year 5 students come into our year one classroom to help create an Easter basket and talk about Holy week with the Year Ones. Once again, have an amazing break. I will see you all next term.



Year 2.. In Year 2 we have had many highlights these last 2 weeks. Every student has advanced in their reading level which is so exciting for them as learners. They have also made a lot of progress in sight word recognition and in their spelling patterns. Thank you to support at home for this to happen.

The highlight of our week was representing the "The Last Supper" as part of Holy Week in our class. We learnt the importance of The Last Supper and that 'serving others' was the message Jesus gave his friends and wanted us to understand. We also looked at the Easter Story and what this means to us in our lives. Some really great discussion followed about our understanding of Easter: that it is not just about Easter eggs, but it is about a fresh start and trying really hard to improve. The rituals have all taught us many things about the message of the Easter story.

We have enjoyed a relaxed week at school and are all very excited about the holidays after working so hard this term. Well done everyone for showing resilience when needed and persistence to keep going when things get tough. These are such important lessons in life. Wishing all families a peaceful Easter. Enjoy your beautiful children!

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Year 3.. I simply can't believe what a wonderful start to the year we have had! I feel so privileged to have shared such an incredible term with all of the wonderful students in Year 3. All students should be so proud of the successes they have achieved. I cannot wait to see what the rest of 2018 brings! Gold star for all!

Year 4.. Wow! What a fantastic start to the school year. In Year 4 these past weeks we have been busy finishing off our Persuasive texts about whether we should have a recycling plant in our local community. The responses to this have been very mature and it is lovely to see the respect our students have for our environment. We may even have some environmentalists on our hands. Our multiplication skills are booming with students becoming prompt with quick recall. A little friendly competition has gone a long way. I think the highlight during this week has been the making of our marble runs. Each group needs to be commended on their efforts and their ability to work in a team to produce some really creative marble runs. Not one group had the same design and some even incorporated 'roadblocks' to make the marble run challenging during a race. Lastly during our Religion lessons we have been looking into the sacraments of healing: penance and anointing of the sick. We have also looked at the different parts of the bible and are able to recall parts of the Old Testament and New Testament. We now look forward to the beginning of Term 2 and the remainder of our school year.

Year 5.. Woohoo! Year 5 smashed the last couple of weeks. Students completed their Gold Rush News Articles to demonstrate their understanding of both the Australian Gold Rush and information texts. After completing our studies on "The Lion, The Witch, and The Wardrobe" by CS Lewis, students were given the opportunity to watch the film and compare this to the original text. In maths, we finished our learning sequence comparing two-dimensional shapes to three-dimensional objects and their representations. On Wednesday this week, we helped the Year 1 students to make Easter baskets and taught them about the Easter story. We wish everyone in the St Joseph's community a joyous Easter weekend and a safe break. See you next term.

Year 6.. Well what a great but busy end to the term. Last week saw us all compete and support other runners in our annual Cross Country which was fantastic to see every one give it a red hot go! This week Mrs Saunders has prepared us with some assessment pieces for Religion and Health which will be due after the holidays. Holy Week began on Sunday with us presenting a re-enactment of Palm Sunday to the whole school. Today (Thursday) will see the whole school re-enact the story of Jesus' last meal - the Last Supper. We are all looking forward to a relaxing holiday and spend time with our families.
