
TERM 2 SCHOOL FEES

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


AUSKICK PROGRAM 2018

Prep. Science topic: Weather in my world: The Weather in my world unit is an ideal way to link science with literacy in the classroom. Students' beliefs and understandings about the air, Sun and wind will be developed as they work through hands-on activities. Through investigations, they will increase their knowledge of how the characteristics of weather affect their daily lives. Health topic: How to keep my changing body healthy: Students explore how their bodies are growing and developing and the actions that will keep them healthy, such as diet, hygiene and physical activity. Physical Education: Students develop the object control skills of rolling, catching, bouncing, throwing, and kicking through active participation in activities, games and movement challenges. They will use personal and social skills to follow rules and cooperate with others. Mathematics: We are continuing with: counting forward by 1's, counting backwards. Counting a collection with the 1:1 connection and matching numerals, quantity, symbols and the words. We are also subitizing (recognising an amount without counting), sorting objects into groups and reading single digit and two-digit numbers. Representing concrete materials of single digit and two-digit numbers. Creating and continuing patterns. Students will sort, describe and name familiar twodimensional objects in the environment. English: We are continuing with: reading strategies; looking at the pictures, sounding out or decoding unfamiliar words and rereading. Before reading the book, we are predicting what the story might be about and making connections to the text. We are continuing to revise; the letter sounds relationship, syllables, rhyming, segmenting and blending and writing simple sentences. We are starting the Magic 100 words. RE: Who is God? What do we know of how the world was created? Communicate their ideas, feelings and thoughts about God

- Listen and respond to the two creation stories in Genesis (Genesis 1:1-2:4a and Genesis 2:4b-9; 15-25)
- Communicate their ideas, feelings and thoughts about the goodness of God's creation
- Identify connections between Old Testament stories of creation and their own personal experience

Year 1. In year one for the past two weeks we have been working on writing a description about an animal. We have revised nouns and verbs and have introduced adjectives. We have been talking about how we can use an adjective to make a sentence or thing sound so much better. In mathematics, we have been focusing on addition, creating our own additions and looking at what two numbers can make up a teen number. We have also been focusing on learning our doubles and our friends of 10. In Science, we have been looking at chemical changes, this week the students were shown a melted icy pole and they had to discuss what happened to it and would it be able to change back to its original state. In Religion, we have been talking about ANZAC DAY and the students attended a liturgy for ANZAC DAY. The students also drew their own poppy for ANZAC DAY, as we have been focusing on lines and colour in Art. In Religion, this term we will be talking about Baptism and Eucharist.

We have had a busy start to term 2. Just some reminders: Sports day and Library day are both on a Thursday this term.

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Year 2... Our focus this week has been ANZAC Day and its importance to us as a country. We made a wreath, some soldiers, a war memorial and read lots of stories. Many students shared stories about their family connections with different involvement in active service. It was so encouraging to see so many students at the Anzac march on Wednesday! In class we have been working on improving sentence structure in our writing and the students have enjoyed making a class scrapbook. Last week in Maths we got busy measuring lots of things in our room and around the school, estimating first then using rulers to measure distances. This week we have been focusing on place value of numbers and ordering them. Our Science unit about "mixtures" is about to get interesting as next week we will be exploring the properties of different mixtures! We also wrote some Prayers of Peace which were beautiful. Keep up the hard work in Year 2.

Year 3. I can't believe the start we have had to Term 2! The dedication and commitment of the students in Year 3 to learning is exciting to say the least. We have hit the ground running and have already begun our new units in Religion, Science, English and Visual Arts. All students are loving using their IPADS inside of the classroom and are now learning to touch type so we can use them even more, particularly in our English. Please remind students to have their IPADS fully charged for the beginning of each day. I can't wait to see what the rest of the term has in store for us!

Year 4... Year 4 have had a busy start to the term. In Maths these past 2 weeks we have been focusing on our basic number facts and looking at place value. We have been investigating numbers by reading, writing, ordering and interpreting them when using number lines. This term in English we are working on writing adventure narratives with this week's focus on the structure of a narrative. We have also started to understand what our government is at Federal, State and Local levels. There have been many deep questions asked and we will answer these in coming weeks. In Religion we are finalising our understanding of the Sacraments of Healing. There has been many videos and readings of the scripture to understand Jesus's mission and ministries and how the sacraments of healing are linked. Term 2 is already looking great.

Year 5.. Welcome to term 2! Year 5 has started learning about information texts in preparation for writing an information brochure and action plan for bushfires later this term. We will be learning about bushfires in our integrated unit. During our literacy rotations, we completed On Demand writing, identified the characters and settings in our class book "Gregory and the Grimbockle" by Melanie Schubert, and practised our typing skills. Our statistics and probability unit has had an amazing start, with students learning all about discrete and continuous data. As we learn about different graphs and forms of data collection, we will decide which type of data they suit best. We also practised our counting, place value and timetables skills during Maths rotations. In Religion, we are learning about the Holy Spirit and how it moves our world. Our science unit has started off with speculating whether objects are solids, liquids or gases. The one that had us stumped was psyllium gel! In French we are learning how to describe our families. To do this, we started with drawing our family trees and labelling each person in French. We are looking forward to a fun term filled with lots of learning!

Year 6.. What a whirlwind start to Term 2. Mrs Saunders has been encouraging us to become more independent

learners by way of thinking about our organisational skills, how we learn best and what type of environment or learning space suits our individual needs. As a group some of us are beginning our MacqLit lessons and working towards increasing our reading and spelling knowledge and skills. In Visual Arts we have been working with Ms Harrison on Picasso type projects, self-portraits and starting to think about our pieces to display at the Art Show later in the term. With regards to our Religious life of the school we re-enacted the Resurrection for the whole school and played a part in the ANZAC Day readings during the liturgy.
