Deserves - yes we believe that students have the right to a quality education.

A great teacher - one who develops strong relationships, knows his or her content and how to teach it, and evaluates his or her impact.

Not by chance - meaning that we have to move beyond the luck of the drawer that permeates much of the educational landscape but to have an appropriate high level of challenge and expectation.

But by design - that has great potential for impacting students learning.

Learning in Literacy is important for several reasons

- 3. Literate people have more choices in their work and personal lives, leading to greater freedom.
- 4. Literacy is great at teaching you how to think successively that is making meaning one step at a time to then build a story.

Week 6 has been and gone so we are now officially past the halfway point of the term. This week we will experience and pay homage to two important Feast days in our Catholic faith calendar – the Feast of Our Lady Help of Christians and the Holy Trinity.

Feast of Our Lady Help of Christians is celebrated every year on the 24th May and is to recognise the



patroness of our country, Australia. It is very special for all Australian Catholics from the when our first Archbishop John Bede Polding announced that the Australian Church would be under the patronage of Our Lady Help of Christians. As, Australians, we can turn to Mary to help us in our need and call upon her to pray for us. In saying this, we might ask and pray this week for forgiveness, in recognising that this Saturday is National Sorry Day and we could be asking Mary to help us make amends for our past mistakes and face the challenges we have towards mutual respect, tolerance and reconciliation in Australia.

National Sorry Day is held on 26th May each year to acknowledge and recognise members of the Stolen Generations. Today our Prep class presented to our school assembly a Sorry Prayer which was absolutely beautiful and significant for us as we move forward each and every day.

Our second Feast day this week is that of **Trinity Sunday**. This will be Sunday 27th May the first Sunday after Pentecost. The word 'trinity' does not appear in any Scripture however, it is taught in Matthew's gospel and 2 Corinthians along with many other bible passages. The feast of the Trinity asks us to reflect on our understanding of God. Our immediate response could be that God is a mystery, but there are some things that we know that can help us appreciate and respond to God. Jesus came and announced that God was Father, Son and Holy Spirit – one God but three persons. That is where the mystery exists for us. However, we know more about God, which we do not call mystery but rather revelation. We know that God our creator loves and cares for us, that God was prepared to send Jesus to live with us, to die for us and rise from the dead so that we may be united with him again. We know that through the Holy Spirit God is present with us at all times.

A scripture passage for the week:

2 Corinthians 13:14

May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.



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Prep.. In Prep we have been explicitly teaching the correct letter formation for each letter of the alphabet. The students are continuing to practice writing their alphabet letters using the correct letter formation. Before guided reading the students go through some sight words. During guided reading groups the students are focussing on retelling main events in the story in sequential order. The sounds that we will be covering in the next couple of weeks are: "'sh', 'ch', 'oo', 'ee', 'th' and 'wh'. The students are continuing to practice writing a simple sentence using capital letters at the start of a sentence and a full stop at the end. We continue to revise; the letter sounds, syllables, rhyming, segmenting and blending. In Mathematics we are learning about 2D shapes and their features, length, weight and capacity. We are continuing counting forwards and backwards and subitizing. In Religion we talked about that God loves us and the students got to draw someone that they love.

Year I.. In English, we have had a focus on words that rhyme, we have finished writing a description about a Gruffalo and we are about to start learning about procedural text, like a recipe. Our focus will be on using lots of adjectives and verbs. In HASS we have been reading the story called "Ernie dances to the didgeridoo" and looking at the six savens in Arnham Land and looking at the six savens. The

at the six seasons in Arnhem Land and looking at our four seasons. The students have had to compare an Arnhem Land season to one of our four seasons. In health, we have been taking about what makes our bodies healthy. The students have all been enjoying participating in AFL every Wednesday afternoon.

Year 2... This week our class began Oral History Presentations about a Local place of Interest. The quality of the students speaking skills and research has been amazing and I know that all of us in Year 2 have learnt something new about many places around Weipa. Thank you parents for your support and guidance with this task. In Maths last week we problem solved using the Think board strategy and made up word stories for maths problems. This made the students think if it was an addition or subtraction problem. This week we introduced repeated addition (multiplication) and we have done lots of hands on activities and arrays and sharing to help us understand this concept. We will be doing much more of this throughout the year. In Religion we have explored the Old Testament story from the Bible, Noah's Ark. We learnt about the covenant and how this applies to our covenant at St Joseph's. We have been mixing it up in class for Science and today SLIME was on the menu, much to everyone delight! To finish off, some fantastic writing is happening. We did a 'demand writing task' last week about "the ladder to the moon", and next week we will be writing another story based on a picture. Rest up over the weekend, busy week ahead!

Year 3.. Iconic natural and man-made features of Australia have been one of our main focuses in geography for the last two weeks. Furthermore, we have investigated one of the more popular islands of the Torres Strait - Thursday Island. The children are using their questioning techniques to examine the island from a geographical perspective. During science the children have been exploring and investigating how solids and liquids are influenced by temperature. The dialogue from the children during hands-on investigations has been fantastic. Maths has had the children reading compasses, analysing maps and interpreting legends. The kids are on fire and we can see they are learning.

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Year 4... The past two weeks in Year 4 like every other class has been busy. We have been working hard on forming well constructed paragraphs in our narrative writing and have developed our understanding in descriptive language. In Maths we have looked maps and directions. The students measured in centimetres and converted them to kilometres. We have also been learning about the chance of something happening. Our understanding of when to determine if an event is likely, unlikely, never or certain to happen is increasing. We are also understanding if events are fair or unfair. In Science we have planted some beans and are now documenting how they are growing and where this fits into the plant life cycle. We have got a busy two weeks where assessment is being completed but our students are definitely up for the challenge.

Year 5.. As this semester starts to pass by we have moved on to learning about narratives and will write our own short stories to a prompt next week. We are also producing a persuasive letter to the editor about an incorrect article in which Miss Cook defined solids, liquids and gases incorrectly! The magazine where the article was published must know that this is wrong! We will prove it to them. In maths we are focusing on polishing up our skills in reading the time on an analogue clock and we are moving towards being able to compare and transfer between 24 and 48 hour time. Our bushfire unit has been completed with the finalising of our Information Brochures and Action Plans, so we have moved on to studying the Needs and Wants of consumers. This new unit teaches aspects of Economics and Business, Maths, and Technology. Students have also started their "Lost Thing" inspired sculptures for the art show and they are looking fantastic.

Year 6.. Mrs Bienvenu returned from parental leave this week. A big thank-you to Mrs Myall for her tremendous effort whilst Mrs B was away. This week in year 6 we have been journalists writing interesting articles for an online newspaper. The students are investigating local news events and using their knowledge of purpose, audience and text structure to create sensational news reports. We have been exploring the relationship between perimetre and area by applying our knowledge to solve real life problems. We commenced our consumers and business unit and will be debating the advantages and disadvantages of global businesses versus local businesses.




