This term is shaping up to be extremely busy with our Stage 2 Opening on the 17th August. This is now only a month away!!!!



What an action-packed week to start our term. This week we have celebrated everything NAIDOC and the women who have been inspirational, motivational and supportive of us. NAIDOC Week is an annual week-long celebration, during which the culture, history and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people are recognised and celebrated.

Over the years, NAIDOC Week has evolved from a protest against Australia Day, to a peaceful week-long celebration of Aboriginal people and their culture. This shift in focus of the event reflects that Indigenous Australians come from an ancient, spiritual and culturally rich civilisation and should be celebrated as such. It also shows that Australians from all cultures can live together peacefully and celebrate their heritage.

NAIDOC Week is an important opportunity for all other Australians to recognise that:

- Aboriginal people are the traditional owners of this land;
- Aboriginal history is ancient and one of the oldest surviving cultures in the world; Aboriginal culture is important to the identity of Australia as a country;
- Aboriginal people and their culture should be recognised and celebrated.

Because of her we can.....

- As pillars of our society, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander women have played and continue to play active and significant roles at the community, local, state and national levels.
- As leaders, trailblazers, politicians, activists and social change advocates, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander women fought and continue to fight, for justice, equal rights, our rights to country, for law and justice, access to education, employment and to maintain and celebrate our culture, language, music and art.
- They continue to influence as doctors, lawyers, teachers, electricians, chefs, nurses, architects, rangers, emergency and defence personnel, writers, volunteers, chief executive officers, actors, singer songwriters, journalists, entrepreneurs, media personalities, board members, accountants, academics, sporting icons and Olympians, the list goes on.

This is the same for most of us. The trailblazing women in our lives are our mothers, our elders, our grandmothers, our aunties, our sisters and our daughters or even significant women we do not know. It was important for us this week to reflect upon these amazing women and what they have done for us and how they have shaped us.

The children this week have produced some amazing portraits of these special women along with speaking about them also in discussions around the school. We would like to especially thank the inspiring and supportive women who play a huge part in our school – St Joseph's both as parents, staff and the wider community. 

The Rosary


